Registration of Artists

Since the outbreak of the COVID-19, the Council has been encouraging and mobilising all artists in Seychelles from all art forms to register with NAC so that we have factual and up to date information available on local artists as the mandating body for

Registration forms are available on the NAC website and at the office since the offset of the outbreak of the pandemic. This will facilitate the . Council with contacting and offering

assistance to all artists in the future, specifically in unforseen events such as the current pandemic.

The registration process is one that is ongoing and aims to register approximately 80% of all professional and semi-professional artists rwith the Council by the end of 2020.

All registered members will be given a membership card and number as a means of identification as an NAC affiliated artist. The statistics NAC gathers will also help in decision making and the formulation of policies in the future.

The hope is this innitiative brings the sector a step closer to being the best it can be for the years ahead.

This called upon a 'Call for Action', where NAC took the lead and conducted a series of consultative meetings with relevant stakeholders including arts associations, the Department Culture, the Ambassador for Culture, CINEA, ESA and SCCI.

As such, this means that there is a need for artists to adapt to the 'new normal' and find alternative ways to practice their art with the aime of generating some income.

The National Arts Council is open to receive any project which is feasible and in which we are able to support so as to eliviate the arts industry from this crisis we have found ourselves in.

Online Music Shop

This project was presented to NAC by Mr. Gilles Lionnet who is a fellow Artist in Seychelles.

Mr. Lionnet's objective is for all musical artists to modernise and learn about alternative ways of selling their music such as online, where there is a wider market for their music.


The first training will be facilitated by Mr. Lionnet on the 3rd June, 2020 and any artists who are interested to participate can contact the council.

Visual Art Danny Sopha

Mr. Danny Sopha is a Visual Artist who was elected to participate in the 2020 Biennale of Contemporary Arts. He is also the Chairperson for the prominent Visual Arts Association 'SEYLAR'. His unique approach to art is to involve the audience directly to write their direct opinions of his art which is what he wanted to do for Biennale this year.

For the exhibition he wanted his art to have an effect on the viewers on a number of levels; intellectually and aesthetically, but perhaps most importantly, spiritually and morally.

He hopes that people who sees this work will think about its various strands and the great deal of the human condition present in his work.

"All an artist can do is open possibilities and minds. I want the viewer to be able to comment on the work, how he/she feels about it and, perhaps, what inspiration can be found in my installation."

Ms. Didon's life in art began after NYS, where she followed a 3 year course at the Seychelles polytechnic and successfully completed her O' and 'A' level in fine arts. In January of 1991 she became an Art Teacher with the Ministry Education and developed as a teacher for 17years before devoting her life to being a fashion designer.

Early in December 2017 she launched her clothing fashion brand under the name 'KATITI SEY-CHELLES'. She has designed wears for afluent pageants such as Miss Seychelles, Miss Regatta and Miss Creole. She has also participated in Accra Fashion Week in Ghana in 2018. She also participated in the first and second Seychelles Fashion Week of 2018 and 2019. Her participation in the Africa London Fashion week was a fruitful one where she successfully promoted Seychelles culture and her brand 'KATITI SEYCHELLES' through her designs.

"I hope to be a well-known and established fashion brand both locally and internationally in the next 5 years. Without the willingness to work hard and put everything into a venture, business success is nearly impossible. Some great essentials to success is perseverance, passion, sacrifice, drive, devotion, willingness and determination but most of all, you have to love what you do."

Ms. Ruth Barbe has been dancing for 32 years. She started dancing with the National Conservatoire of Performing Arts at the age of 4 and at the age of 6 she passed her first dance exams. She moved on to become at a teacher at a very young age.

She received a 3 years scholarship to attend the prestigious Academy in the west of Australia the "Western Australian academy of Performing Arts". After graduation she returned back to Seychelles where she taught dance as a Senior Dance Instructor, choreographer still at the National Conservatoire of Performing Arts with the School Of Dance at Mt fleuri and also teaching dance classes on Praslin. Ms. Barbe has been given opportunities to direct and choreographed events over the past few years, such as National day show, Cable and wireless Cable Tune Awards amongst others. In 2019 she won the Arts Award Dancer category.






Patrick Victor Cultural Ambassador

For the last 10 years Mr. Marie has been in a private drama group (Modesti Theatre) and produced a local drama yearly. He was the Chairperson of the Theatre Association of Seychelles (TAS) for 8years.

Nowadays transforming his writing, acting, directing and video editing skills into another good use. As a Television Programme Producer, he has now entered the world of film where he has produced two films for Seychelles Broadcasting Corporation (SBC).
